Charge

“...reviewing our current tuition and relevant fees and making appropriate recommendations for adjustments for consideration for the 2017 – 18 academic year.”

Guiding Principles

1. Any tuition and/or fee increases should enable the University to continue to enhance the quality of our students’ educational/learning and their academic success;
2. We must continue to demonstrate added value consistent with recommended tuition and fee increases; and
3. We must continue to justify that any recommended tuition and/or fee increases will consistently improve student success.



General Administration 2017 – 18 Instructions

- New guaranteed tuition program fixes tuition rates for first-time full-time resident undergraduate and transfer students that remain continuously enrolled for eight consecutive semesters.
- A maximum of 2% increase to resident TUITION annually.
- A maximum of 3% increase to required FEES annually.
- Graduate and professional school tuition rates should be established consistent with each program's unique market and academic requirements.

Required Tuition and Fee Justifications

- Tuition - \$0 - 400

Additional tuition revenue will be used to support the instructional priorities of the University, including supporting student success and retaining outstanding faculty.

- Athletics Fee - \$22

This fee increase is required to meet the increasing cost of providing the transportation, equipment, medical insurance and medical care that are required to maintain our Division I Athletics program.

- Health Services Fee – \$5

This fee increase will be used to support new programming for first year students. Healthy Sisters and Healthy Brothers is designed to provide students with the skills needed to prevent the spread of sexually transmitted infections.

- Student Activities - \$36

This fee increase is part of a multi-year strategy to address the additional operating and equipment expenses that will be associated with the opening of the new Student Union in 2018.

- Educational and Technology Fee - \$21.14

The fee increase will fund additional upgrades of computer labs and classroom equipment. The increase will also fund a position to support student-facing initiatives. This position will be responsible for technical and analytical work in developing, designing, and supporting applications that directly impact students.



Miscellaneous Tuition and Fee Justifications

- Farm Shelter - \$25; Harrison Auditorium - \$300

This fee will cover additional operational expenses, facility and equipment maintenance, and facility upgrades. Fee paid only when facility is used for non-University business.

- Lab Fees - \$7 – 55

Cover cost for acquisition, maintenance, and repair of consumable and non-consumable lab materials, supplies, and equipment. Fee paid only by students who enroll in specific course.

- Elementary Education Certification Fees - \$100 - 140

Cover the cost of testing which is required to be certified as a teacher in North Carolina. Fee paid only by students who are required to test.

- Housing Processing - \$25

This fee increase will support the purchase of additional room furniture, mattresses, and other equipment needs in the residence halls.

- Board Rates - \$100

This fee increase will support enhanced menu variety and extended hours of operation in the Aggie Dome, Starbucks, and Simply-To-Go.

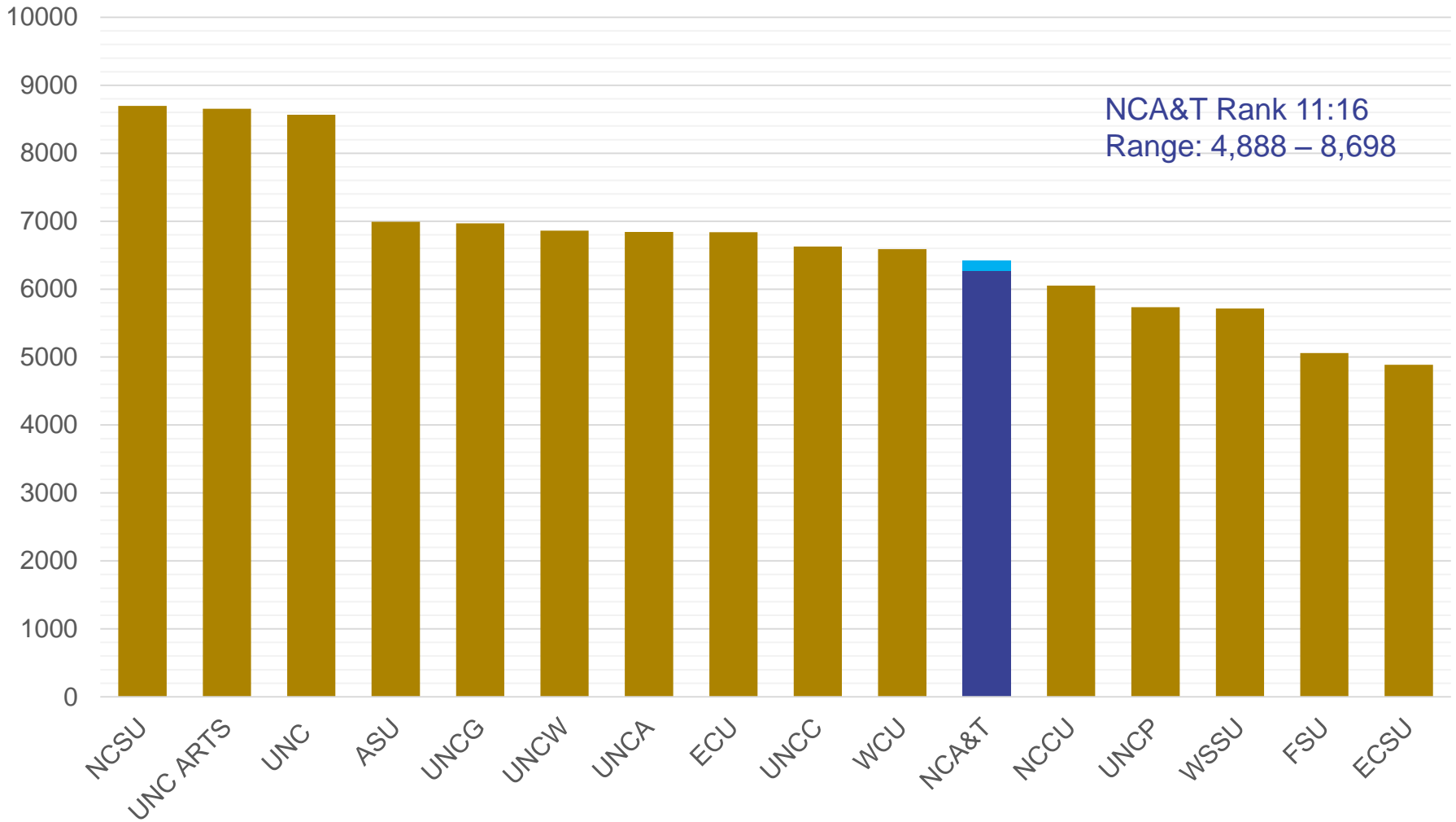

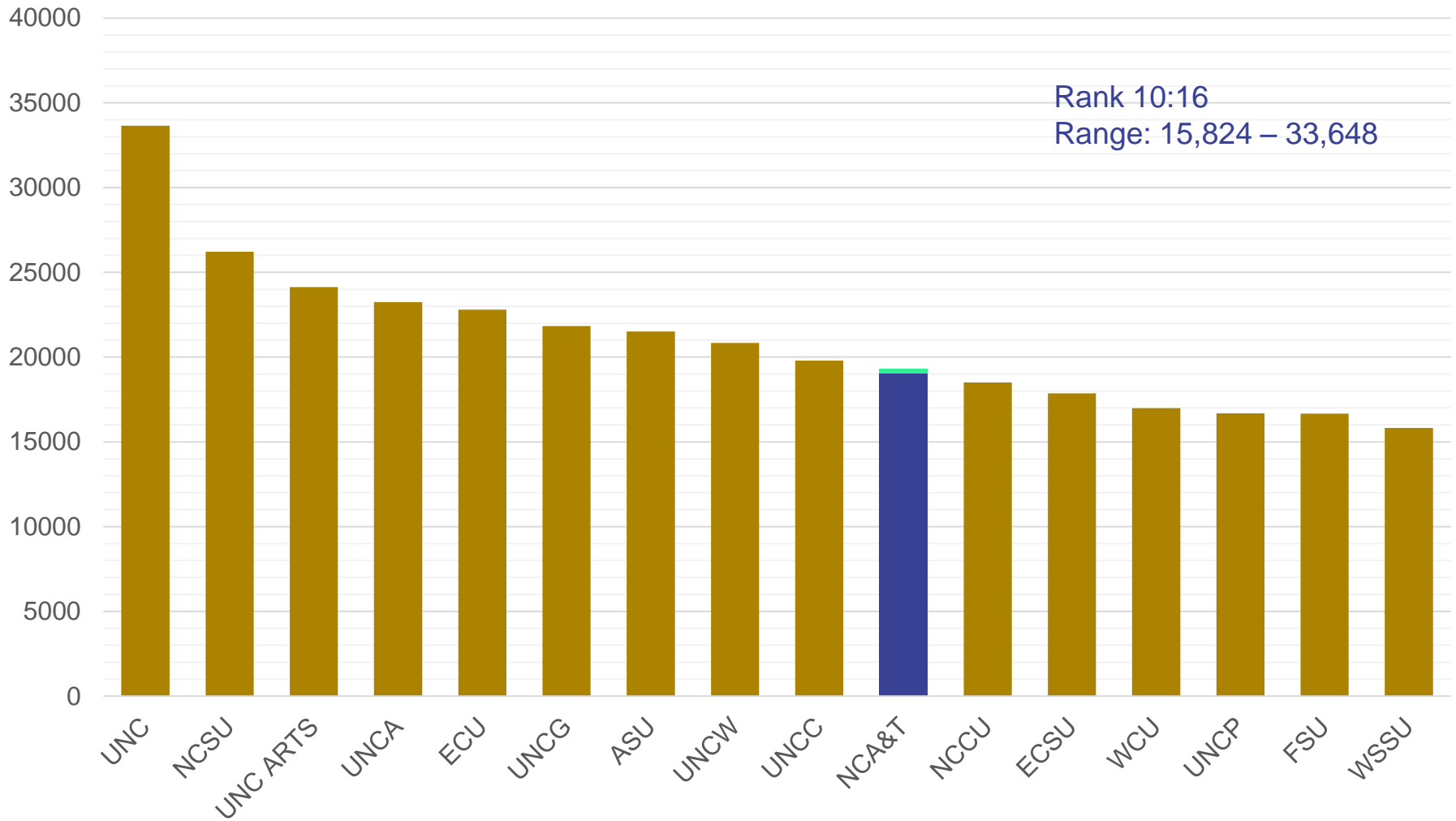


Total Tuition and Fees (Resident Undergraduate) 2016



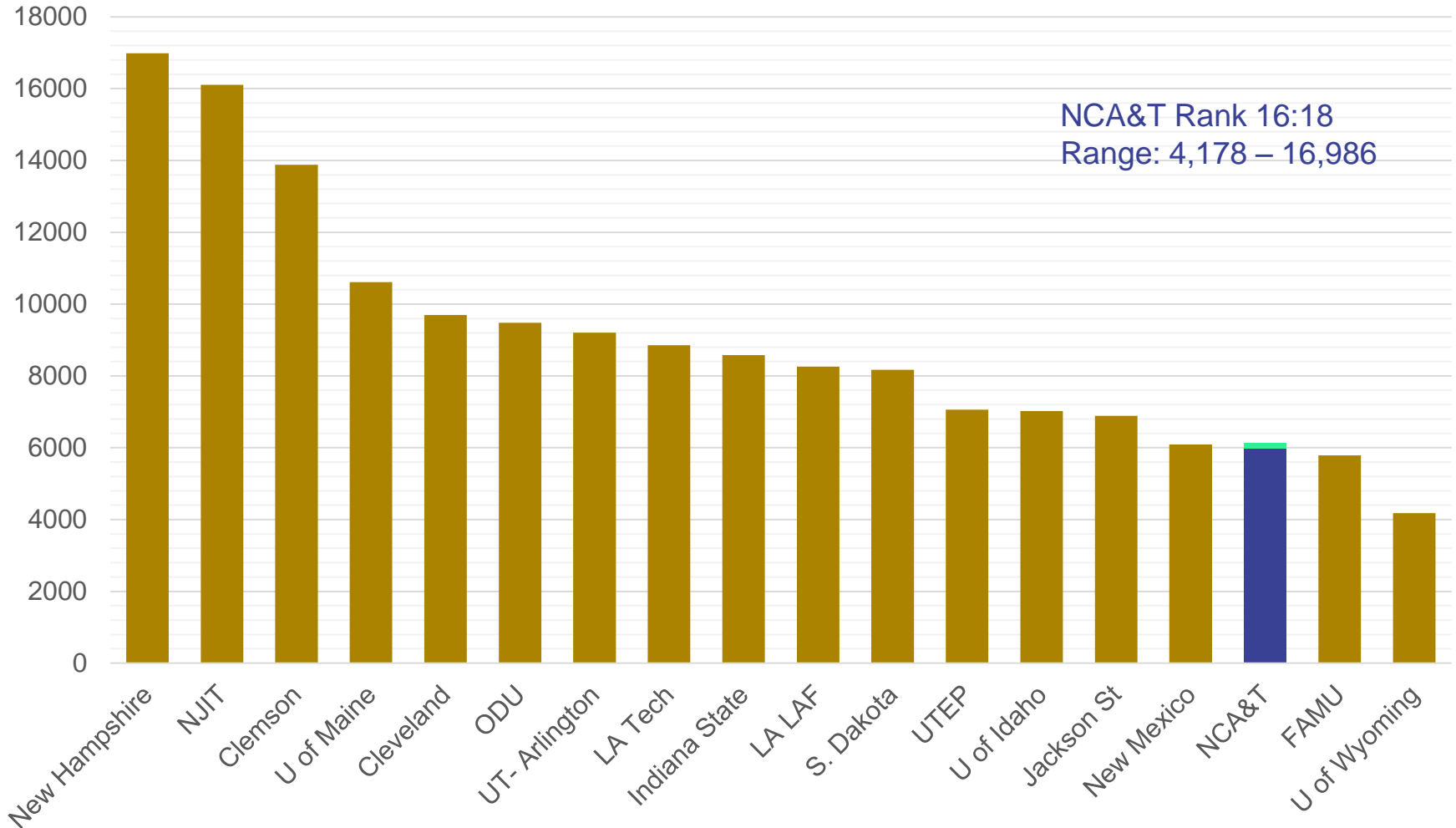


Total Tuition and Fees (Non-Resident Undergraduate) 2016



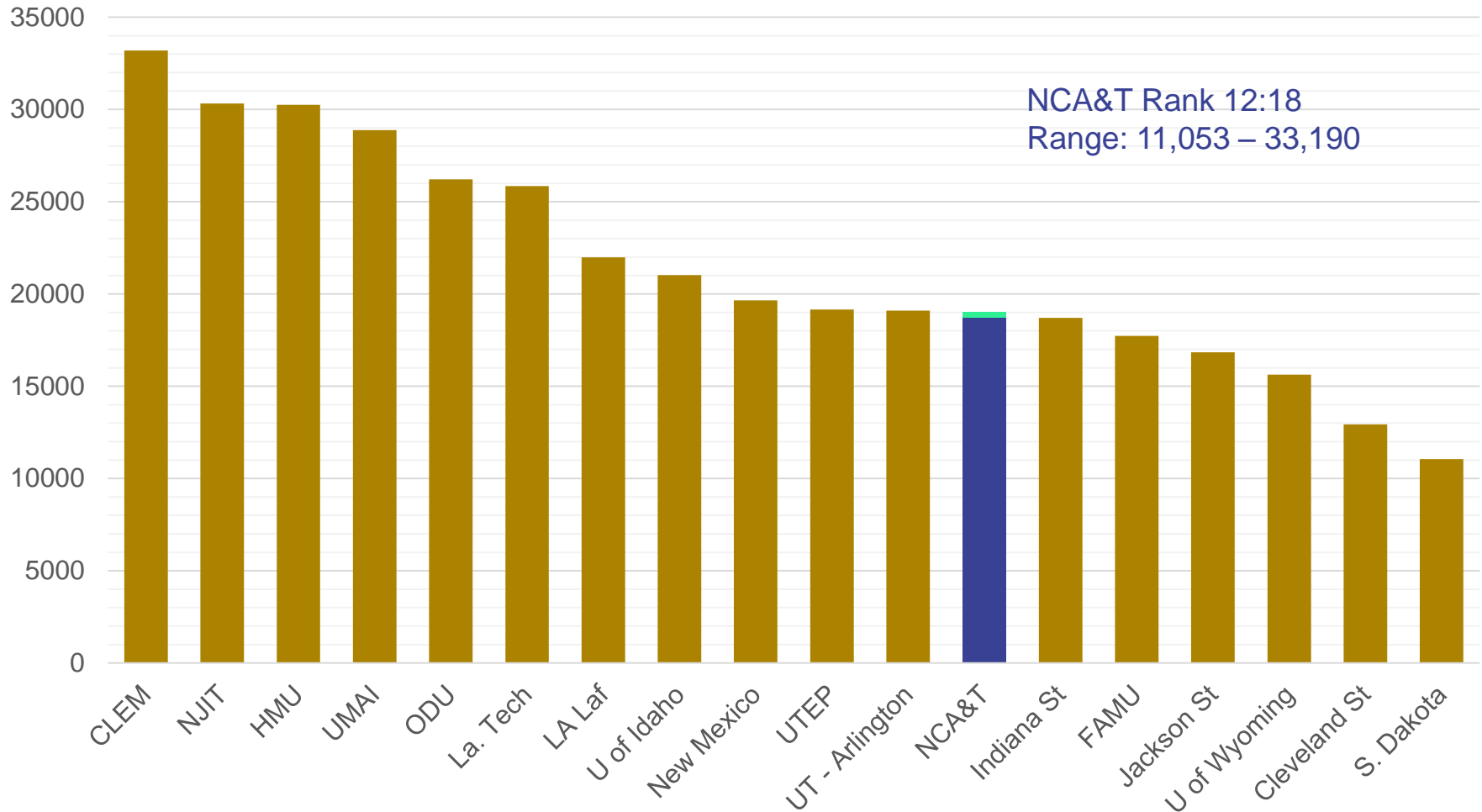


Non UNC Peers Total Tuition and Fees (Resident) 2016





Non UNC Peers Total Tuition and Fees (Non- Resident) 2016



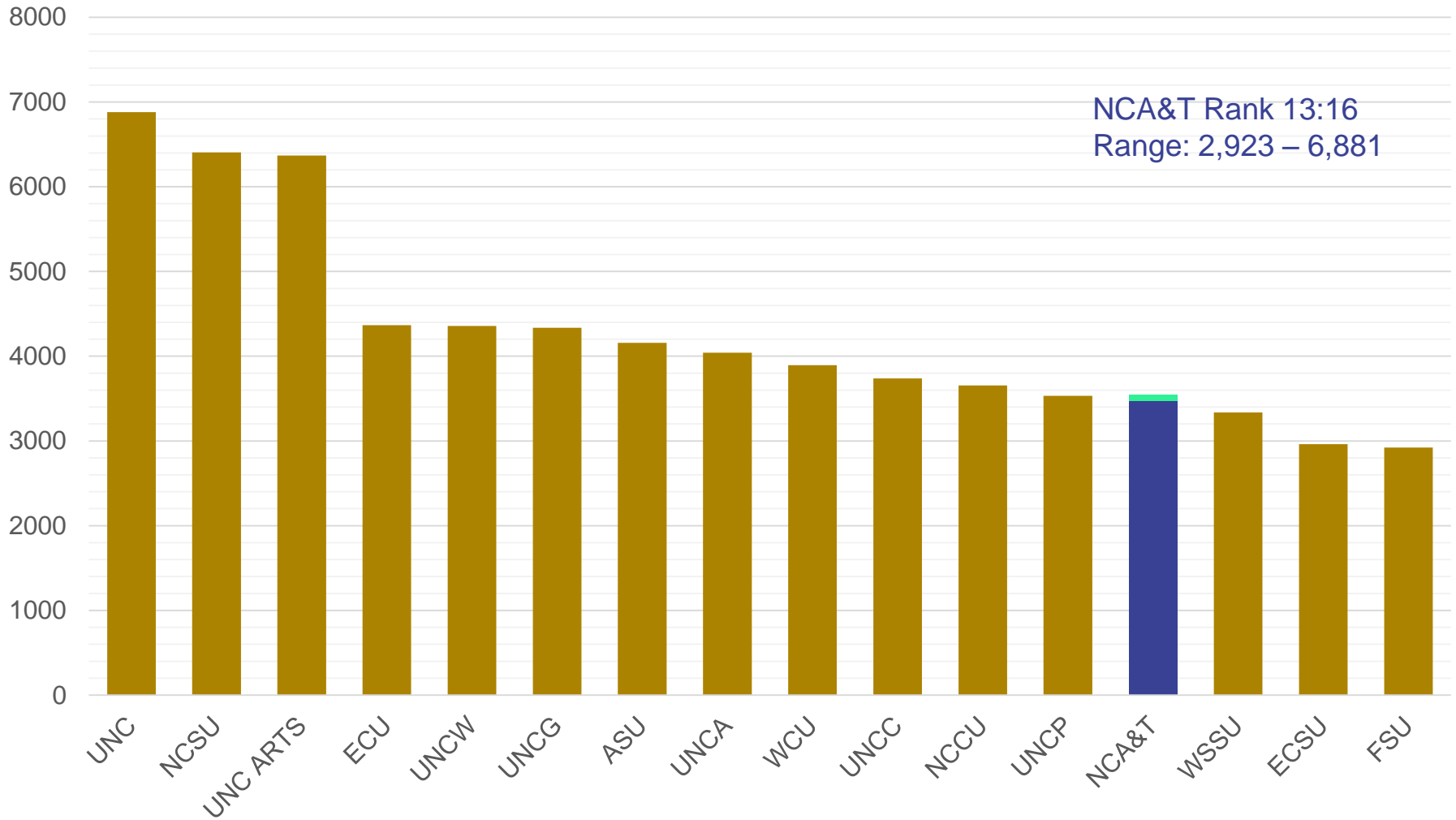


Tuition

Tuition payments cover the cost of maintaining the entire academic enterprise.

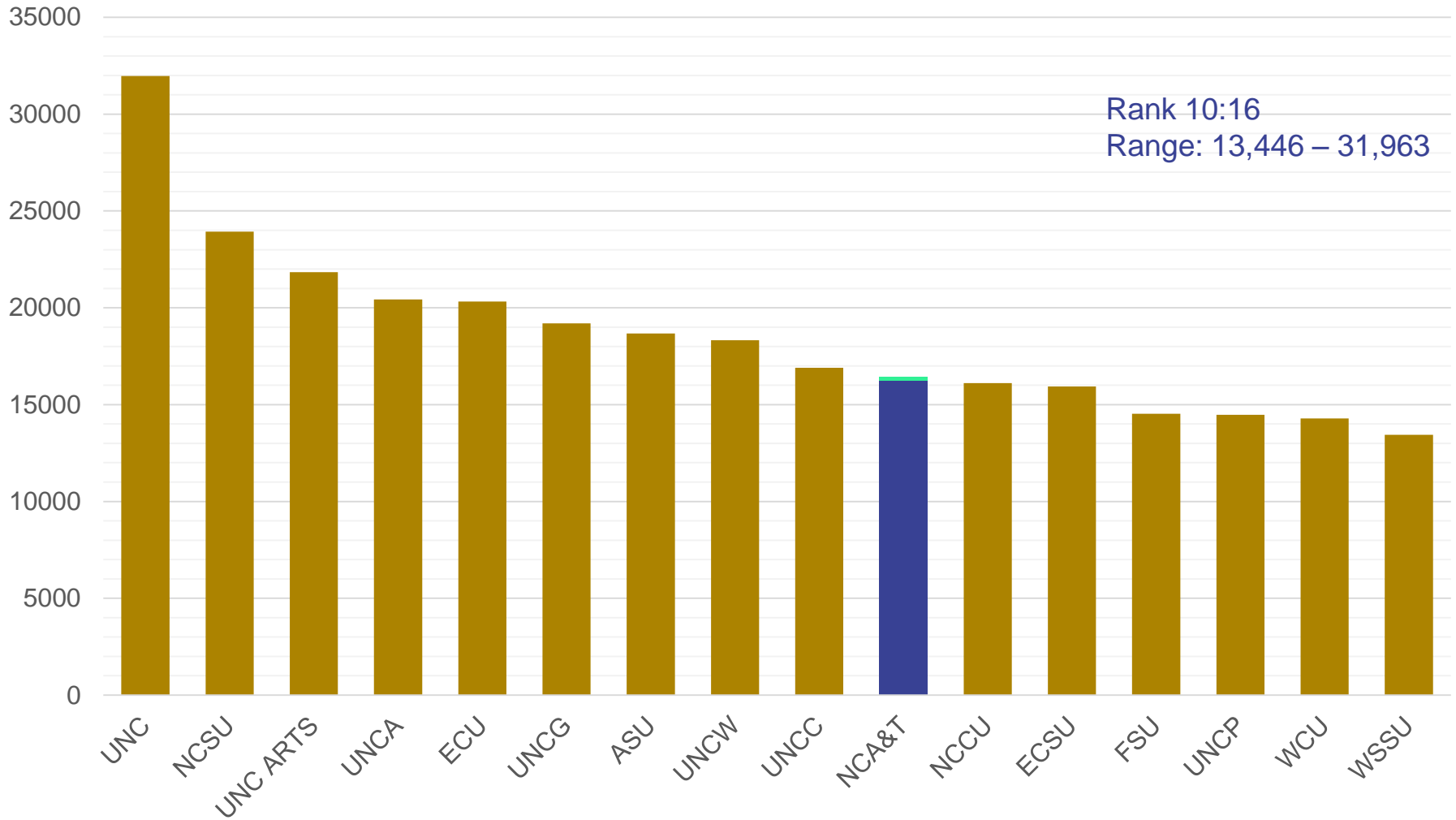


Total Tuition – Residential Undergraduate 2016





Total Tuition - Nonresident Undergraduate 2016



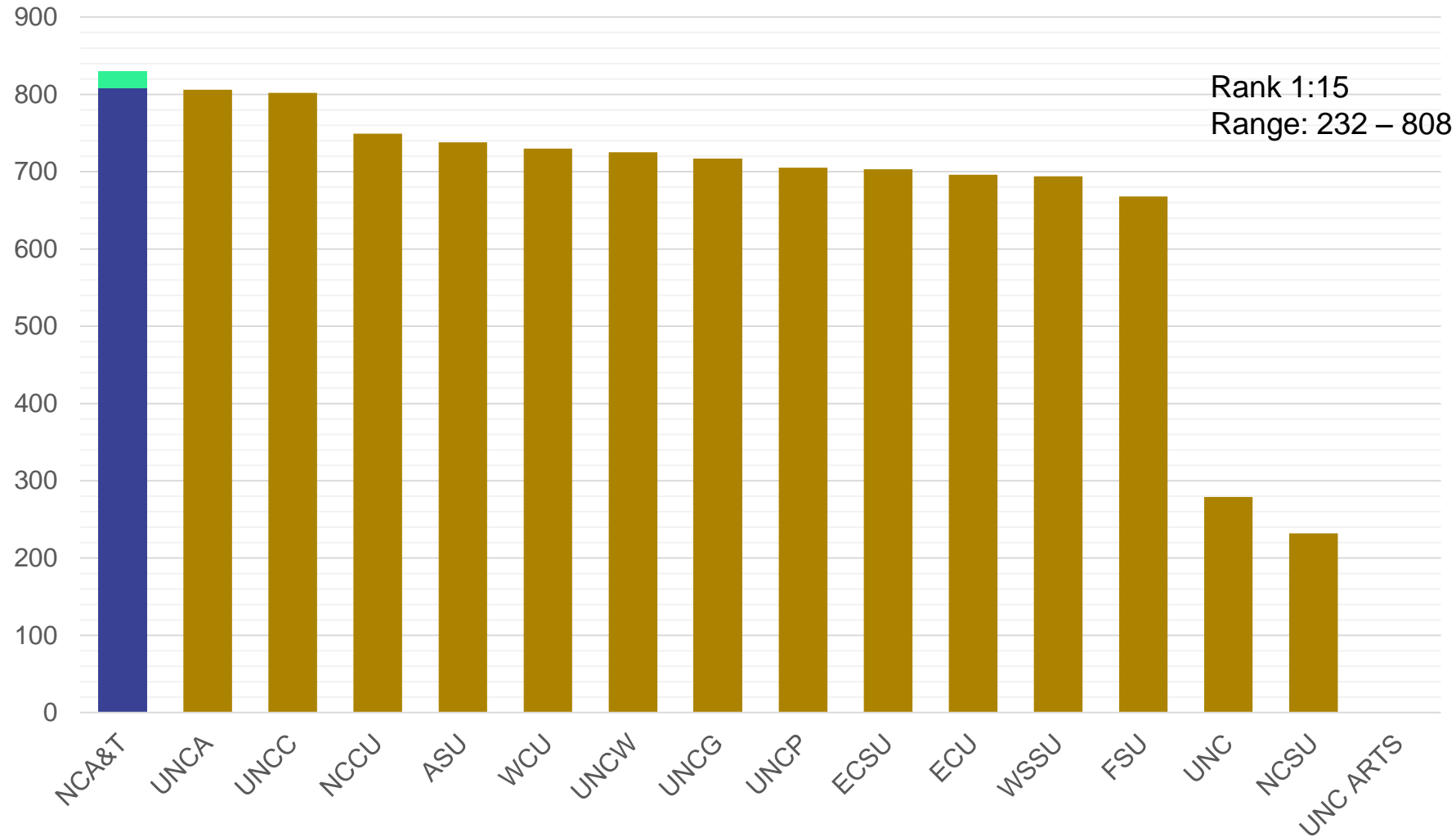


Athletics Fee

Athletics Fee 2016



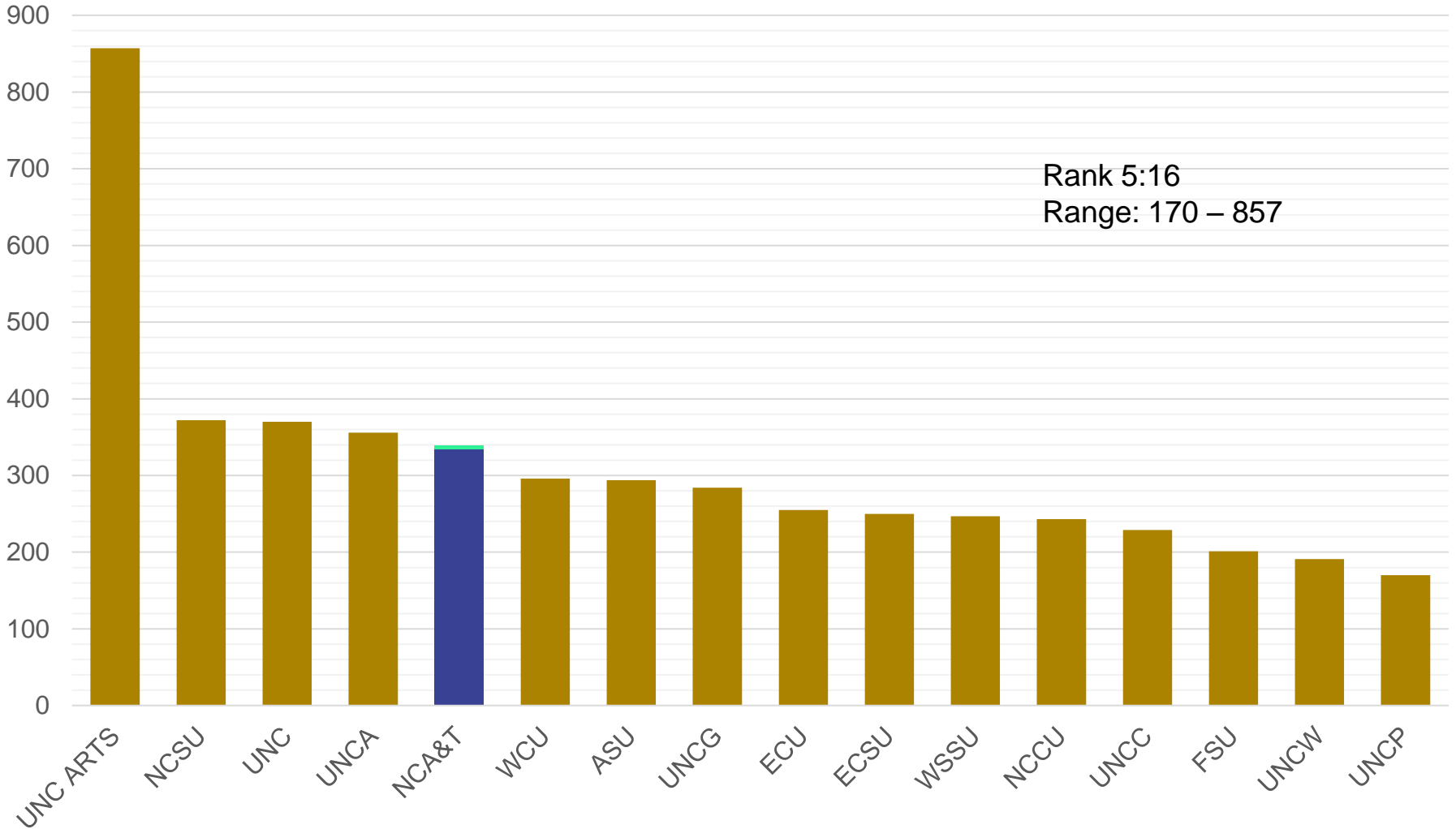


Health Services Fee

Health Service Fee 2016



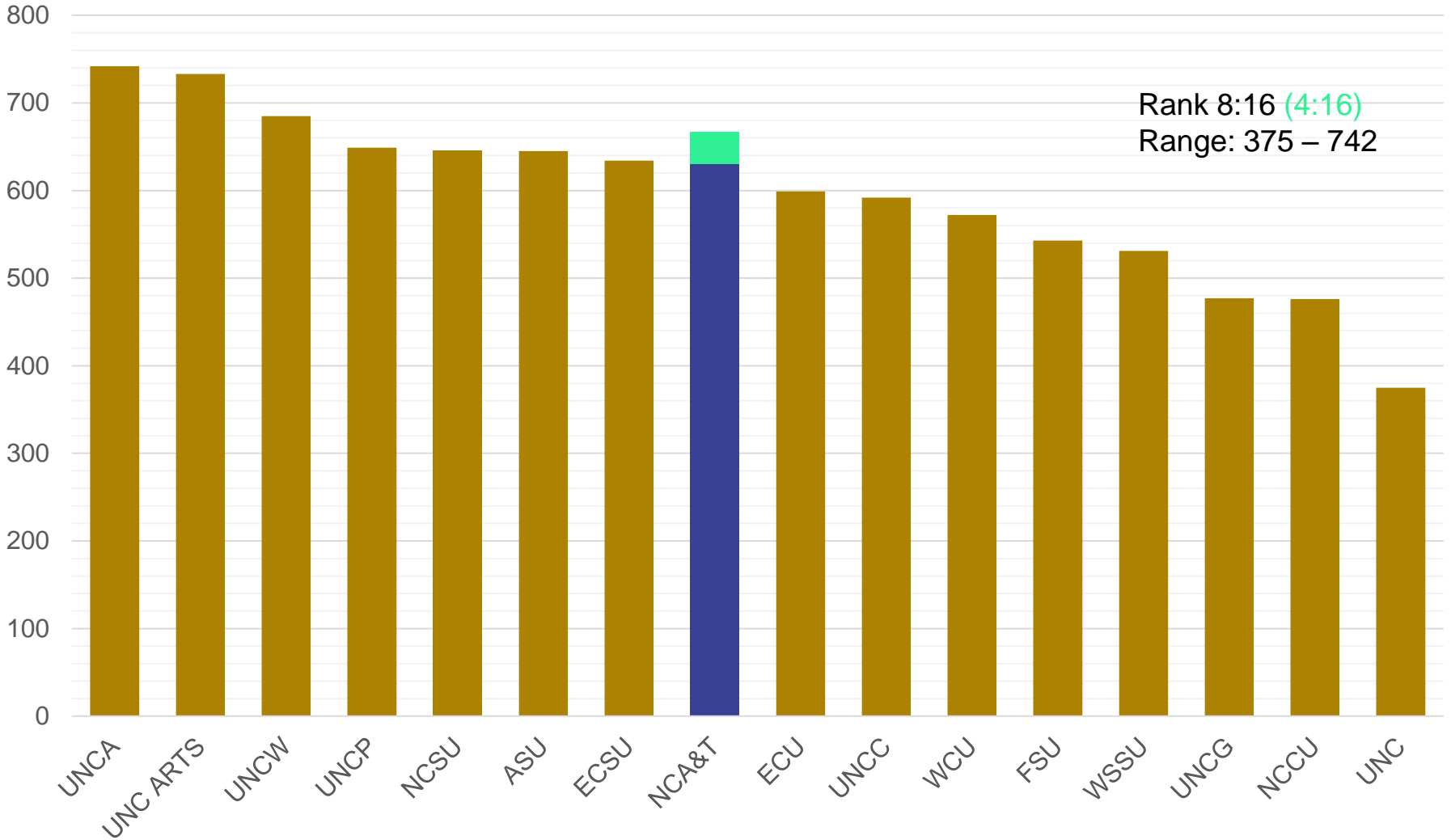


Student Activities Fee

Student Activities Fee 2016



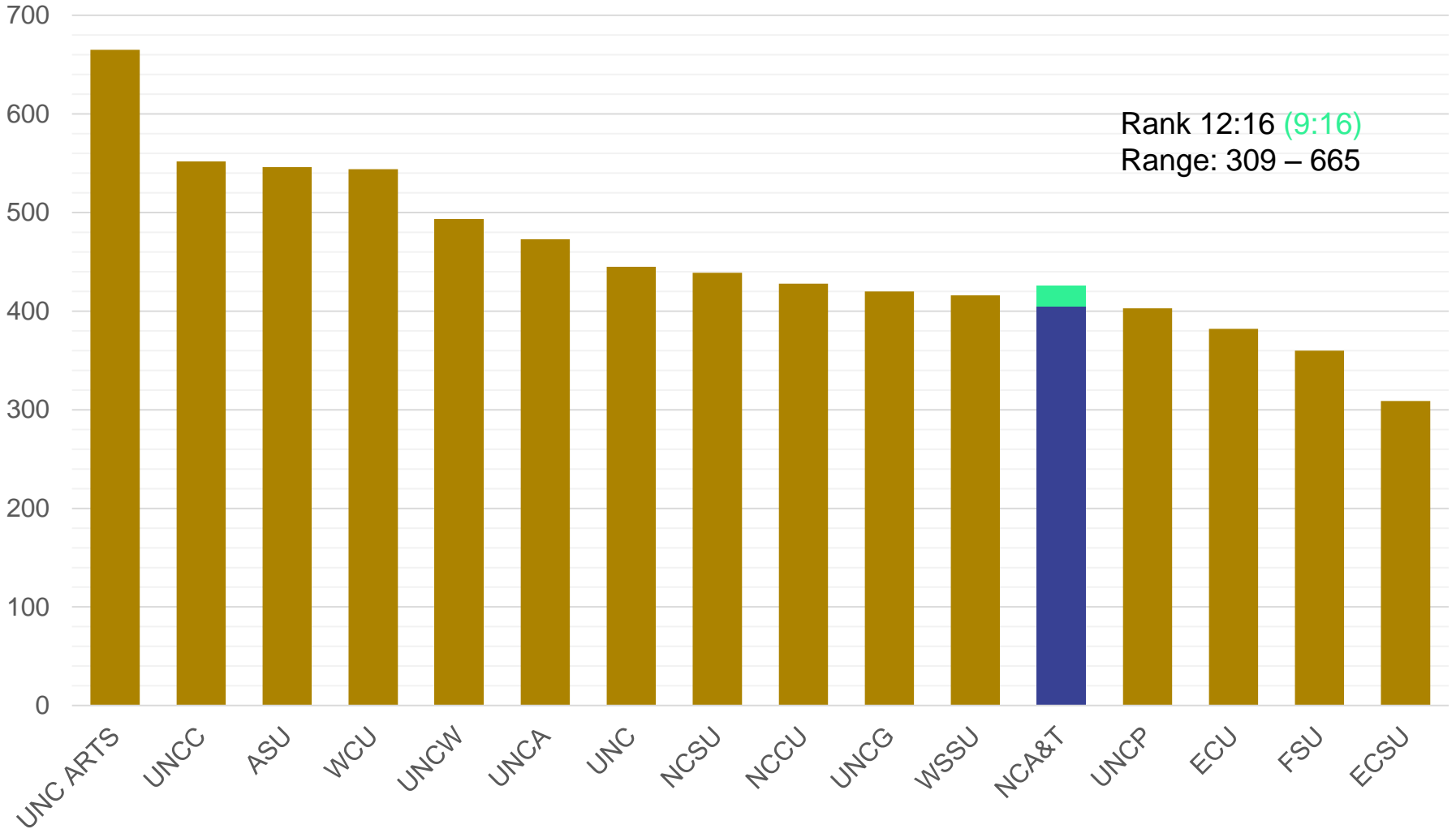


Educational and Technology Fee

Education and Technology Fee 2016



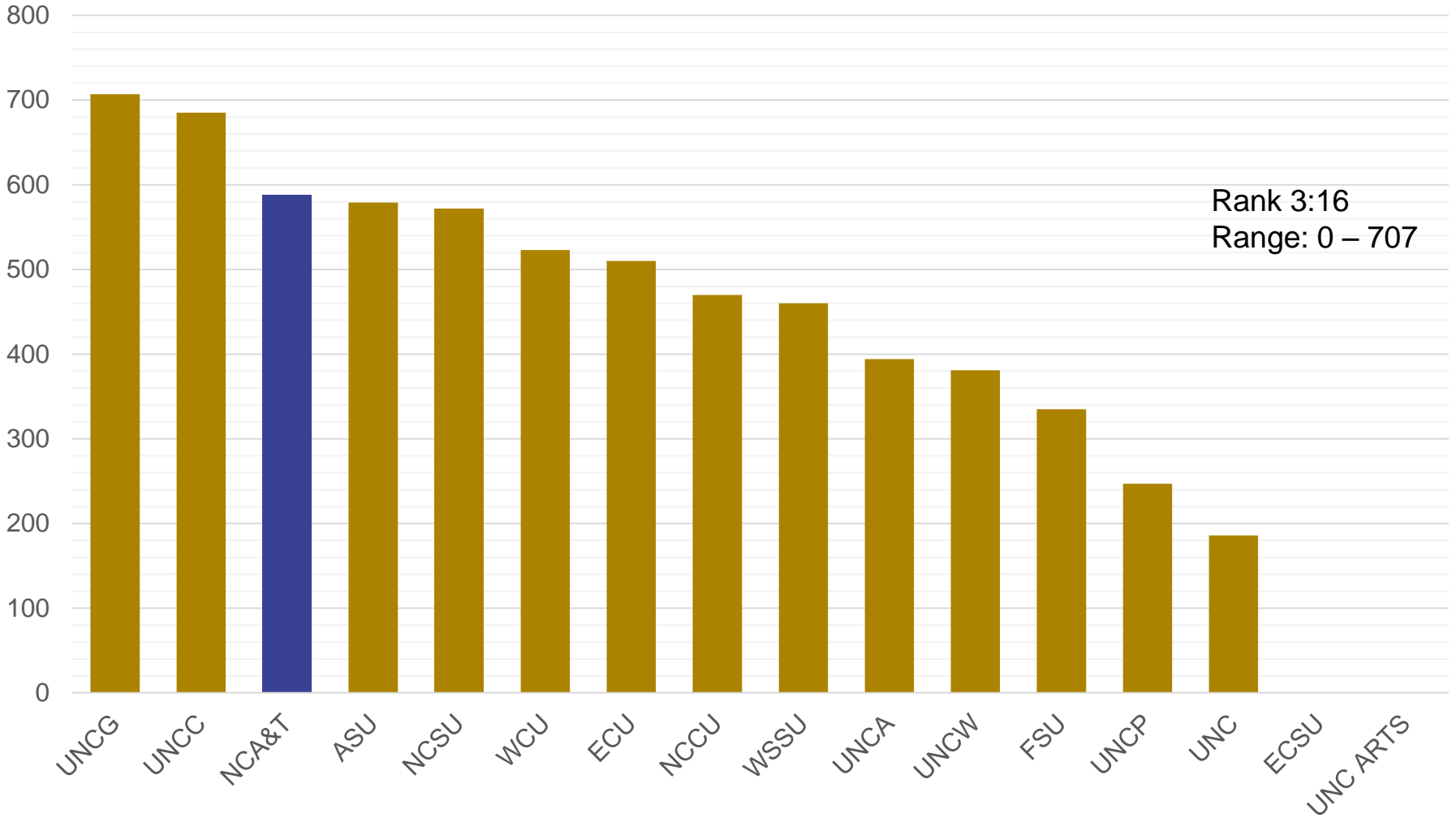


Debt Service Fee

Debt Service Fee revenue is used to retire indebtedness for capital projects not supported by state funds. The fee is reduced as the debt is retired.



Debt Service Fee 2016



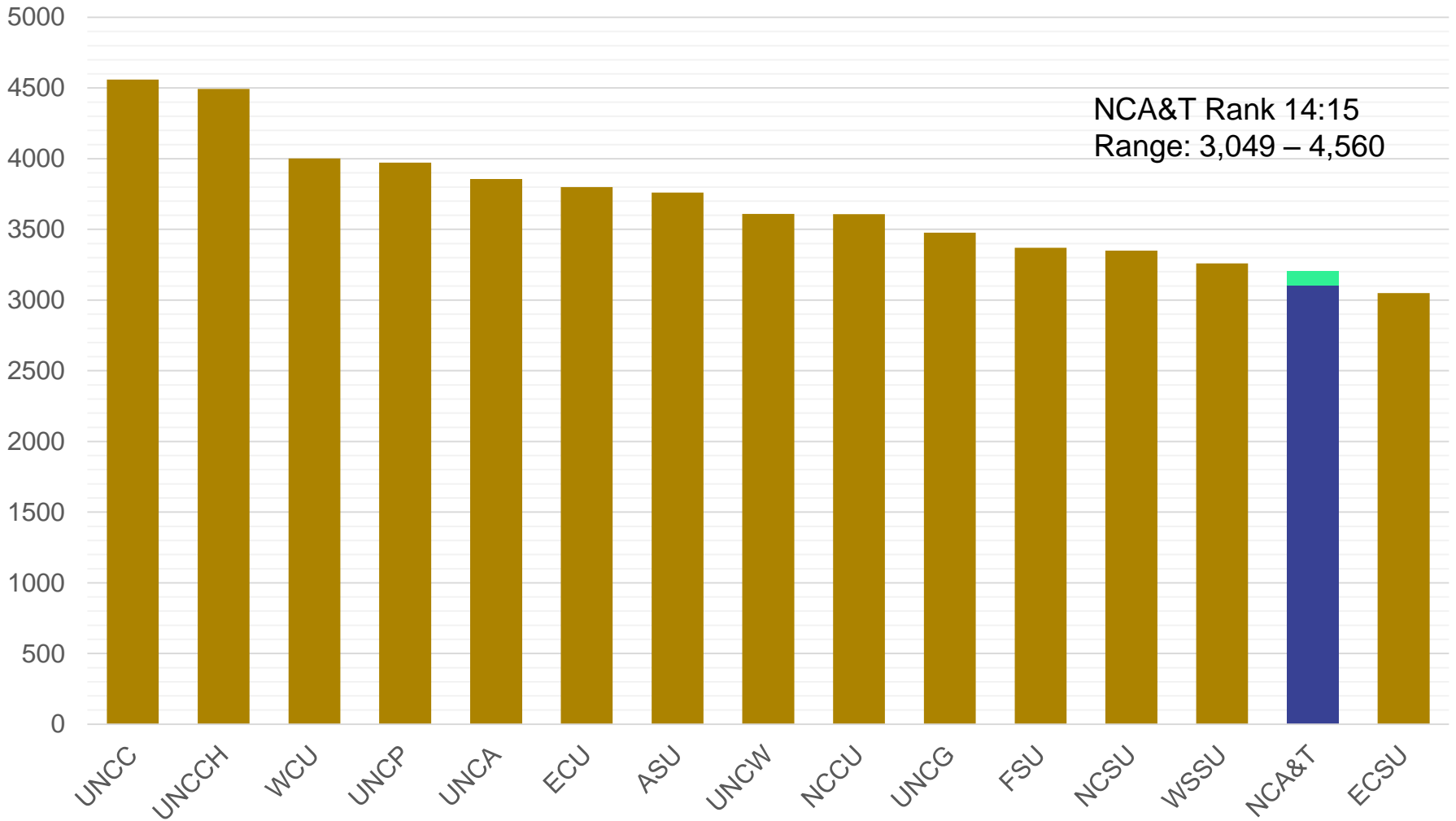


Board Fee
