## University Police Department

- **SUPPORT SERVICES**
  - Approximately 60 officers (sworn officers, university security and contract security)
  - Continue to patrol campus in vehicles and on foot.
  - Twenty-four (24) hour security coverage in female residence halls.
  - 7AM-7PM in other residence halls.
  
- **PATROL SERVICES**
  - Foot & vehicles patrols and utilization of T-3s, Segways and Bikes.
  - Residence Hall “Safety Talks” (Drug, Alcohol Awareness & Sexual Assault).
  - Active shooter presentations.
  - Conducted 59 patrols in August; 120 patrols in September and ?.

## University Public Safety Advisory Committee

### MISSION:

To remain responsive to the needs of the campus and local communities, while providing the University Administration and the Chief of Police with regular input on issues surrounding crime and community relations, law enforcement, public safety, and emergency preparedness.

### FUNCTIONS:

In the performance of its duties, it is expected that the University Public Safety Advisory Committee (UPSAC), will meet two times per semester. At the request of the Chief of Police. The UPSAC may meet at additional times during the year for purposes as may be specified. The UPSAC shall receive information regarding the University Police Department training, practices, and general data.



### CHARGE:

- Recommend further actions and programs that will raise the level of safety awareness among all members of the University community.
- Analyze crime statistics reported by University Police Department (UPD) & Greensboro Police Department (GPD) related to the University and its surrounding areas.
- Continue an on-going assessment of the quality of safety policies, practices, procedures, and programs by reviewing critical incident on and around the University.
- Review existing programs and suggest improvements in safety education, particularly for students taking evening courses, using campus services such as libraries and computer labs during evening hours, and living in residence halls.



**CHARGE(continued):**

- Conduct regular lighting tours of campus to maintain a safe environment for those on campus during evening hours.
- Review and identify potential sources of funding for future and current programs related to personal safety on campus.
- Identify ways to utilize academic programs for the enhancement of personal safety on and around the university.
- Review and suggest improvements to campus preventative and judicial policies on sexual assault.

## AGGIE RESIDENCE HALL WATCH PROGRAM: (AGGIE RHWP)


- Officer assigned to every residence hall on campus.
- Officers will be responsible for walking thru and/or making contact with Hall Directors & RAs during their tour of duty.
- Officers will also be responsible for crime prevention programing within their residence hall.
- Residence Hall Officers (RHOs) will be included in this process.



### Drunk Buster Alcohol

Drunk Buster goggles improve the effectiveness of any substance abuse awareness and training program. Impairment goggles are easy and safe to use. Utilizing vision distorting lenses, Drunk Buster goggles simulate the effects of alcohol consumption on the body. Slip on the goggles and experience the effects of reduced alertness, delayed reaction time, confusion, visual distortion, alteration of depth and distance perception, reduced peripheral vision, double vision, and lack of muscle coordination. Combine the goggles with otherwise simple participant tasks like walking the line, picking up coins, setting objects on a table and you'll create engaging and effective impairment demonstrations that won't be forgotten soon.

### LiveSafe @ NCAT: Mobile Personal Safety


A mobile app for students, parents, faculty and staff to engage with NCAT Police.

View and engage in a Social Safety Map, with directions to nearest safety locations and information on latest crime in the community.




