1890 University Funding Provisions

- Evans-Allen – Funded at \$54,185,000 for FY 2018 (same as FY 2017)
- 1890 Institutions Extension – Funded at \$45,620,00 for FY 2018 (same as FY 2017)
- 1890 Capacity Coordination Initiative – Funded at \$9,219,000 (was not funded in FY 2017)*

These Capacity Coordination funds will support three Centers designed to increase diversity in the science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) pipeline; increase profitability and jobs in underserved and limited resource farming communities; and enhance talent preparation related to global food security. The Centers also will increase coordination and collaboration between USDA and the 1890 institutions. The Centers will each have a specific focus, including: (1) innovative and sustainable small farms, ranches, and landowners; (2) motivation and education of students for achievement; and (3) international engagement and development.



HBCU General Funding Provisions

- \$1 million increase for the HBCU Historic Preservation Program.
- \$34.9 million increase for Strengthening HBCUs in Title III.
- \$9 million increase for Strengthening Historically Black Graduate Institutions in Title III.
- \$1.4 million increase for Strengthening Predominately Black Institutions.
- \$1 million increase for Strengthening the HBCU Master's Degree Program.
- \$1.3 million increase for Minority Science and Engineering Improvement programs.
- \$34 million increase for Child Care Access for Parents in School. (This was tripled.)
- \$10 million increase for HBCU Loan Subsidies.
- \$90 million for the HBCU Hurricane Supplemental Loan Program.
- \$8.5 million increase for the Office of Civil Rights at the Department of Education.
- \$5 million for a pilot on open textbooks, which would help bring down the cost of college.



HBCU Pipeline and Research Provisions

- \$60 million increase for Federal TRIO programs.
- \$10 million increase for GEAR UP.
- \$14.1 million increase for the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities at NIH.
- \$32 million for Minority University Research and Education Project at NASA.
- \$35 million for HBCU Undergraduate Program at the National Science Foundation.
- \$7 million increase for the Department of Defense's Historically Black Colleges and Universities/Minority Institutions (HBCU/MI) program.



General and Research Provisions

- Increase in the Pell Grant maximum award by \$175 to \$6,095.
- \$107 million increase for Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)
- \$140 million increase Federal Work Study
- \$8 million increase Institute of Education Sciences (IES)
- \$5 million for a “pilot, competitive grant program to support projects at institutions of higher education that create new open textbooks or expand their use.”

- Department of Agriculture- National Institute of Food and Agriculture
\$25 million increase for the Agriculture and Food Research Initiative
- Department of Defense-Science & Technology
The bill includes \$14.864 billion for Defense S&T, a \$853 million increase from FY2017
- Department of Defense-S&T, Basic Research
The bill provides \$2.34 billion for S&T Basic Research, a \$67 million increase from FY2017.
- Department of Defense-Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency
The omnibus includes \$3.072 billion for DARPA, a \$183 million increase from FY2017.
