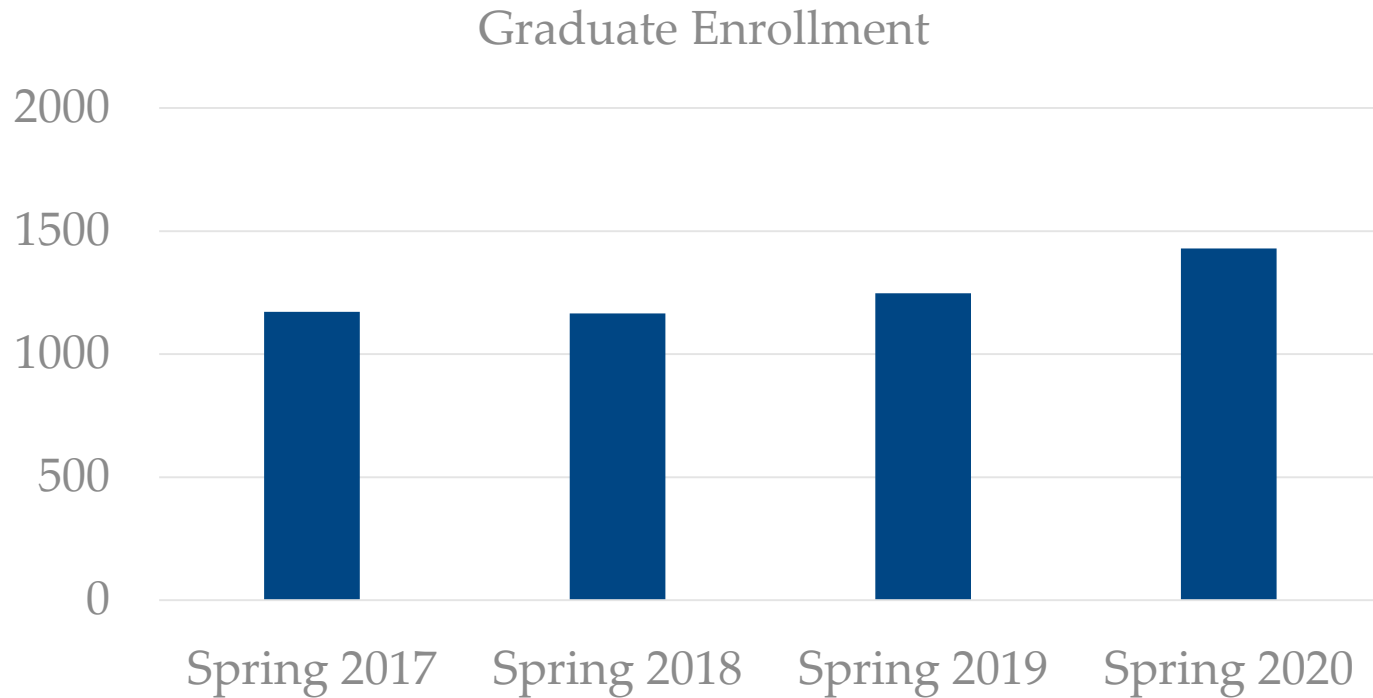
Strategies for Incomplete or In Progress Application Conversion

- Targeted email to recruit high achieving students with tuition remission

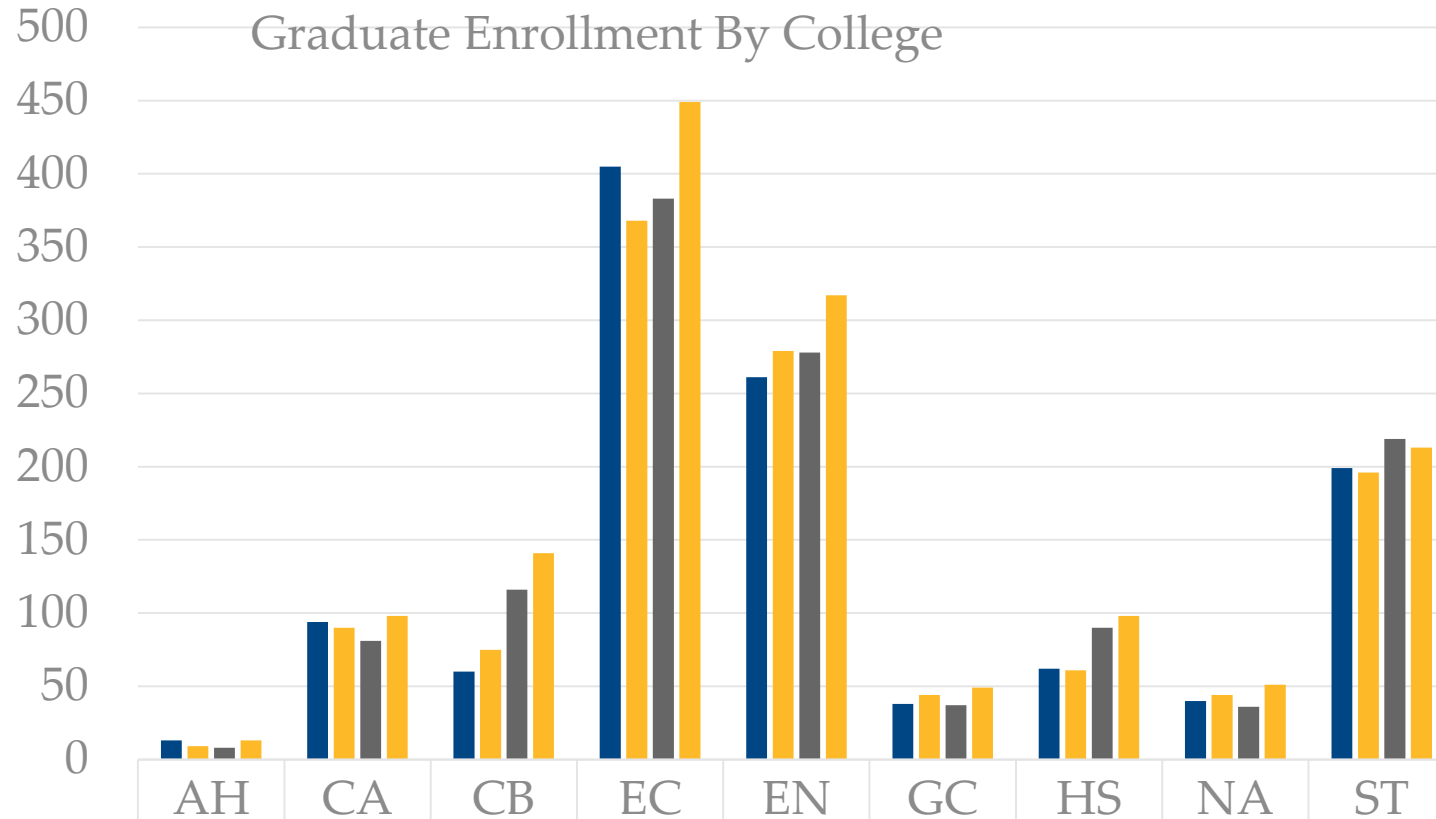

Graduate Enrollment: Spring 2017-2020



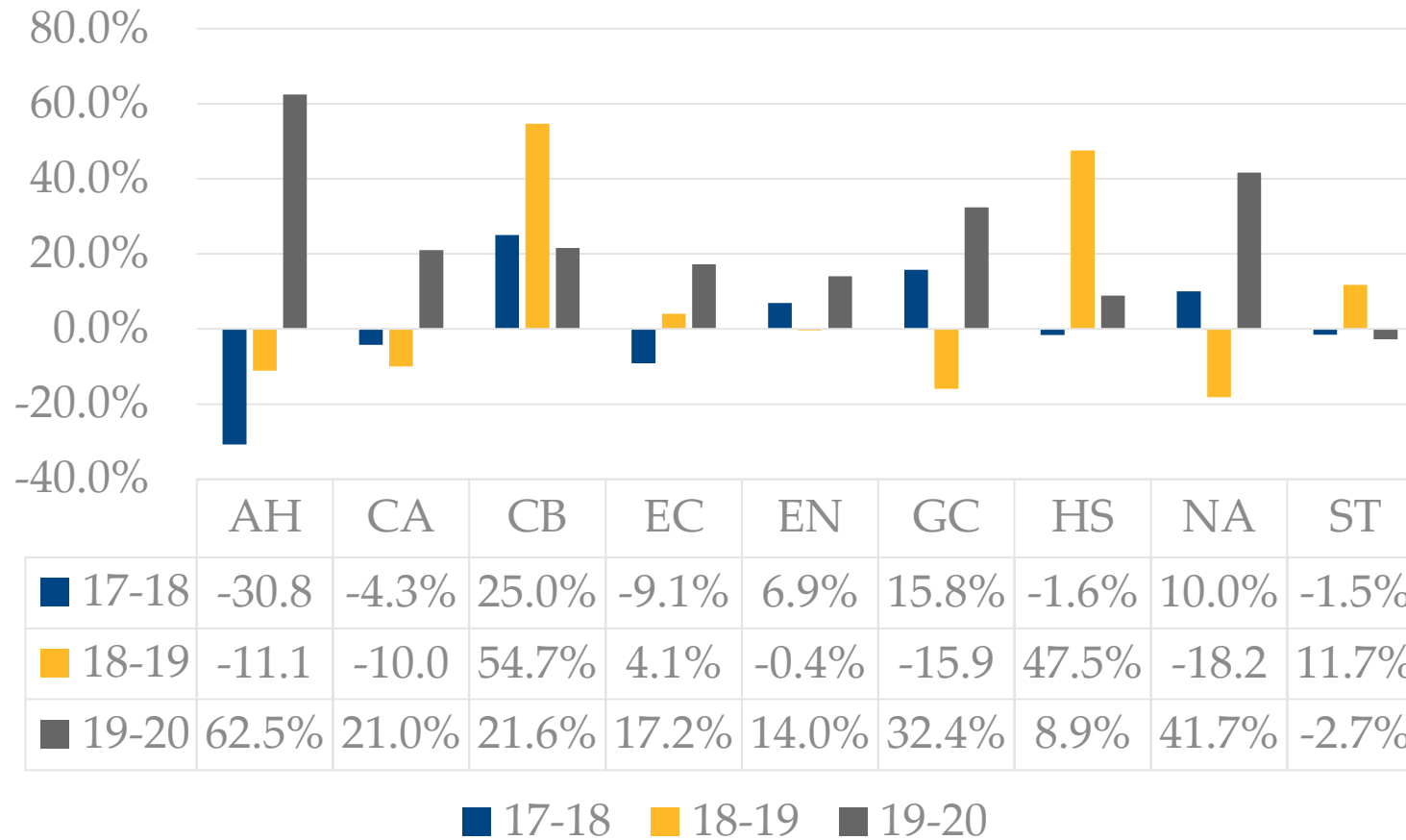

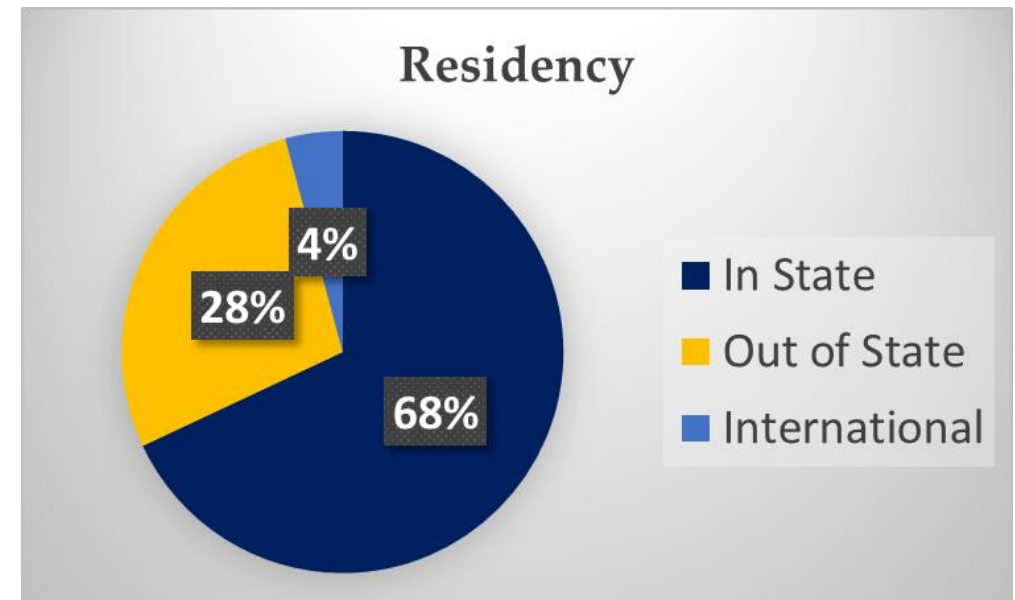
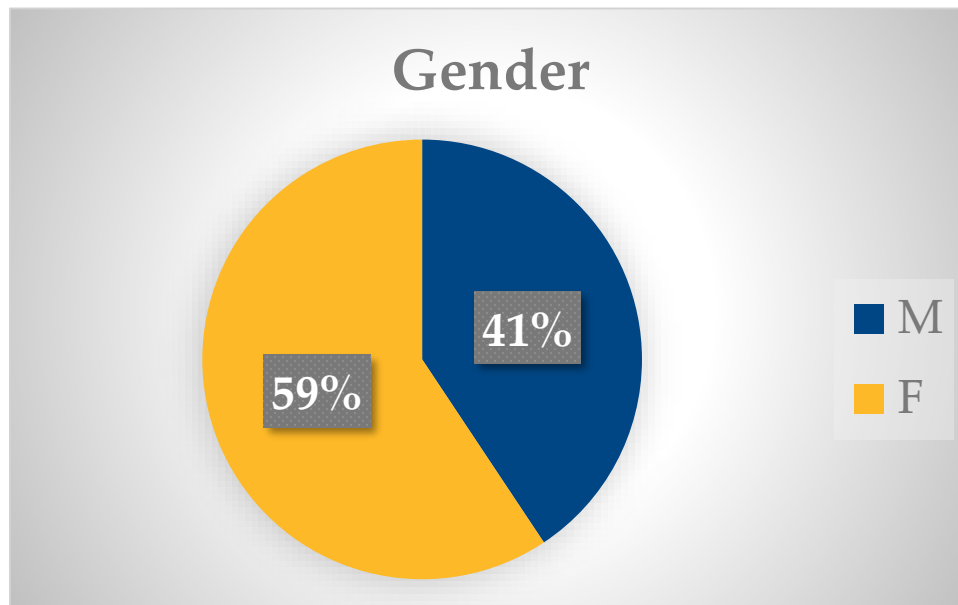


Enrollment Change By College



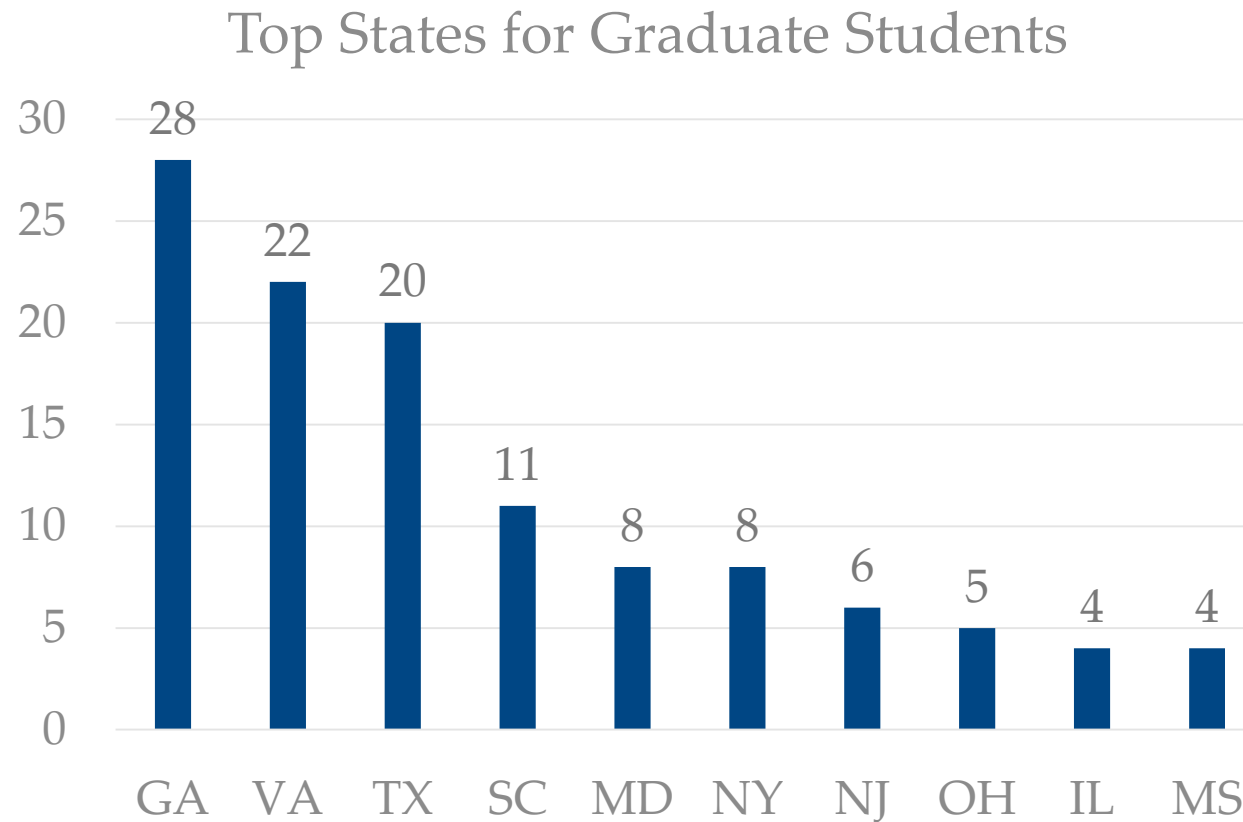


Student Profile: Residency and Gender

Woodland Hall Fellowship Program: Reintroduced Last Year

Overview

- Merit-based fellowship program for master's and doctoral students who are committed to excellence in scholarship, research, and leadership in a research university setting.
- The Fellowship is named in honor of Woodland Ellroy Hall (1909-2004), the first student to earn a graduate degree from North Carolina A&T State University in 1941. Hall, a native Virginian, earned a bachelor's degree in agriculture from the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, a master's degree in agricultural education at North Carolina A&T, and a second master's at Columbia University. Hall also did doctoral work at Pennsylvania State University.





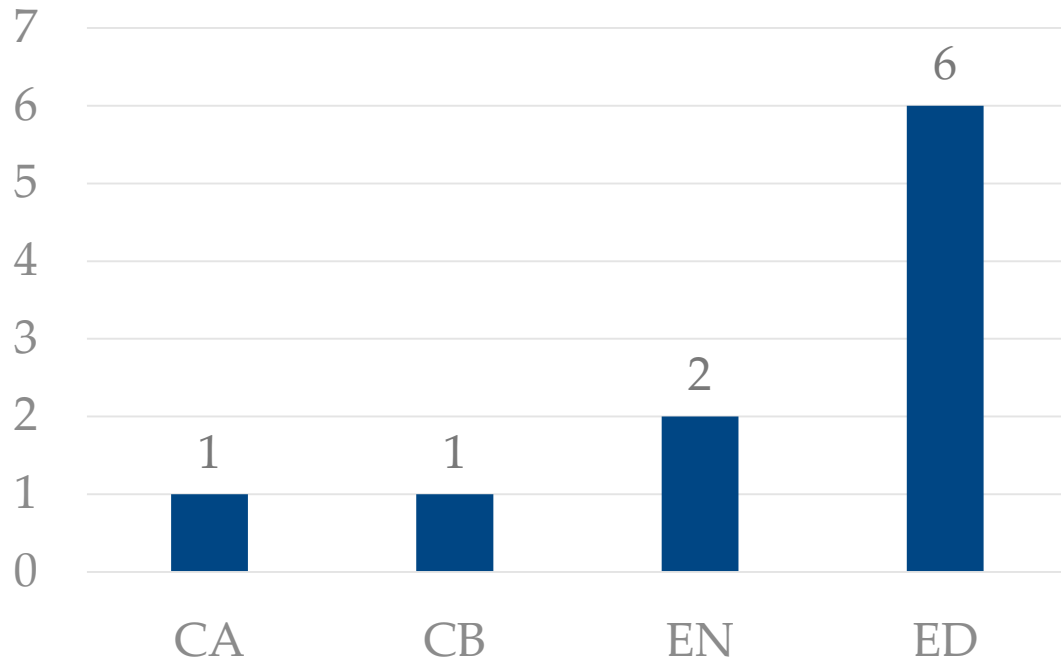

Statistics

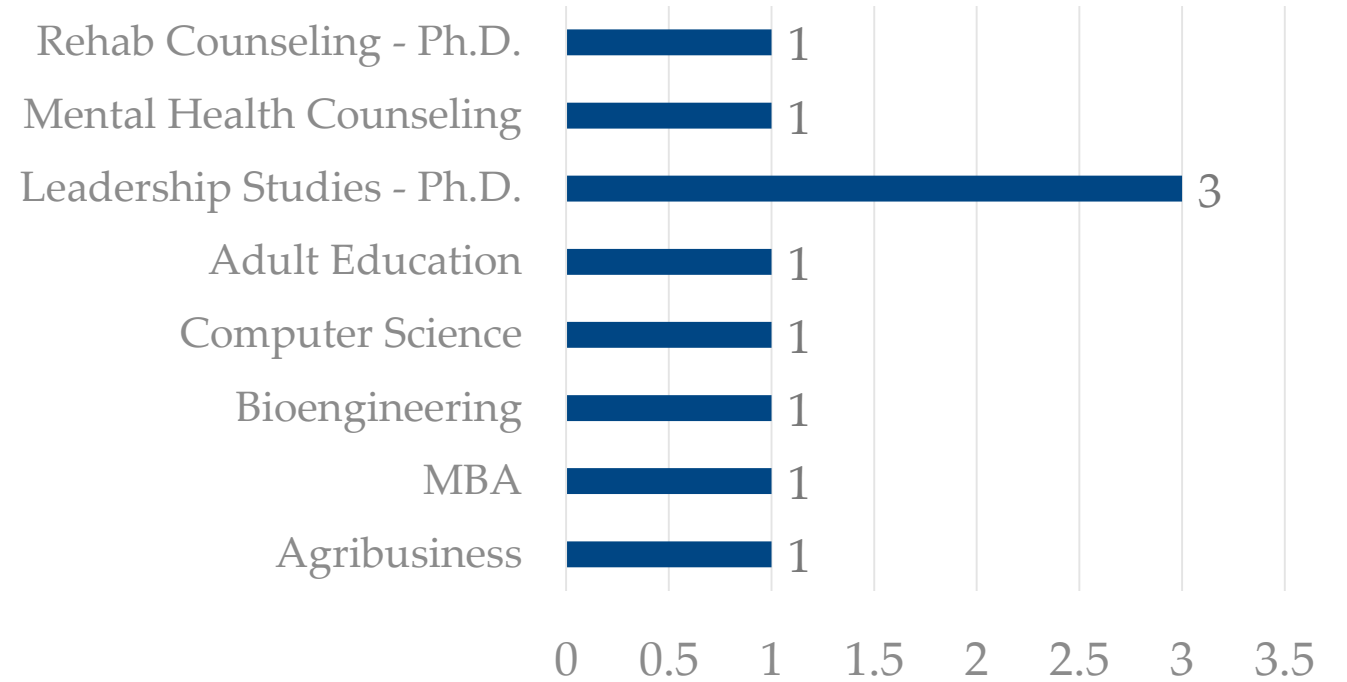
- Number of applications received: 87
- Number of finalists invited to campus at their own expense (February 21-22): 27
- Number of students to be selected for the award: Approximately 10
- Students receive tuition, fees, health insurance, and a stipend for the first year
 - > \$13,500 for MS students
 - > \$18,000 for Ph.D. students

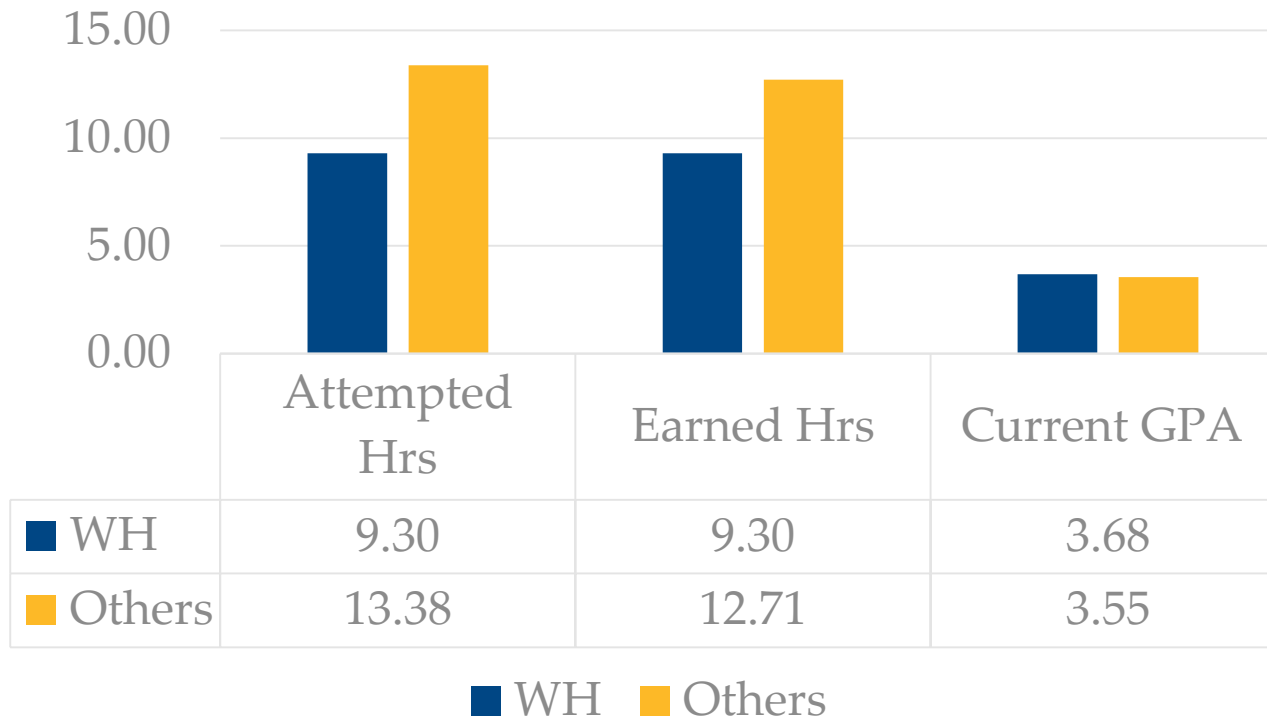


WH Fellows By Major

Chancellor's Fellows

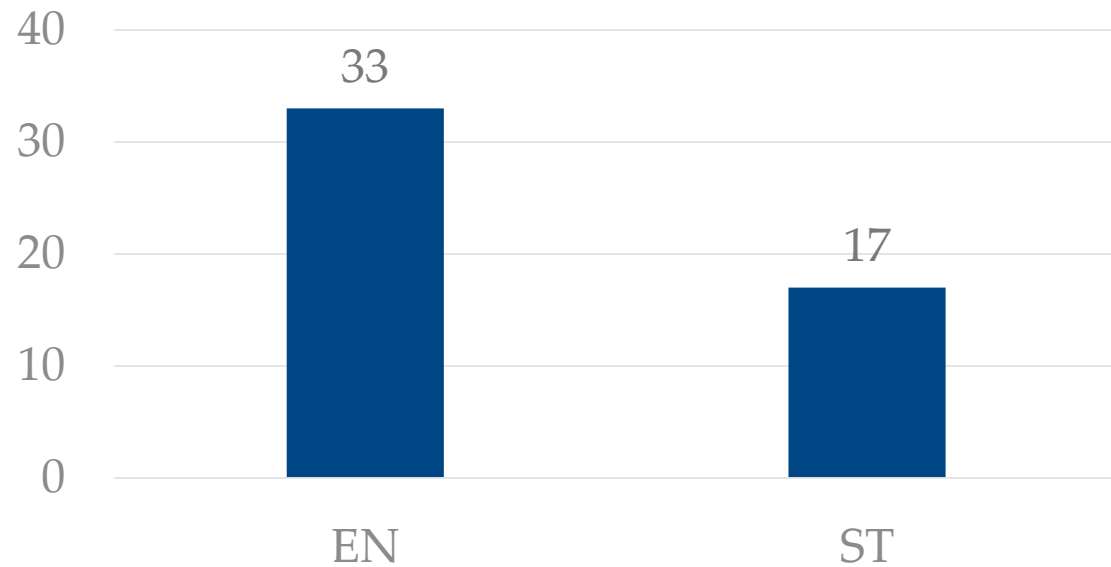
NCA&T State University – Supported by Title III HBGI Grant

- 50 Chancellor's Fellows - African American Ph.D. students in STEM fields are supported by Title III HBGI Grant.
- The Fellowship, includes a \$30,000 stipend plus tuition, fees, and health insurance benefits.
- The fellowship is awarded one year at a time and may be renewed each year based on satisfactory performance.

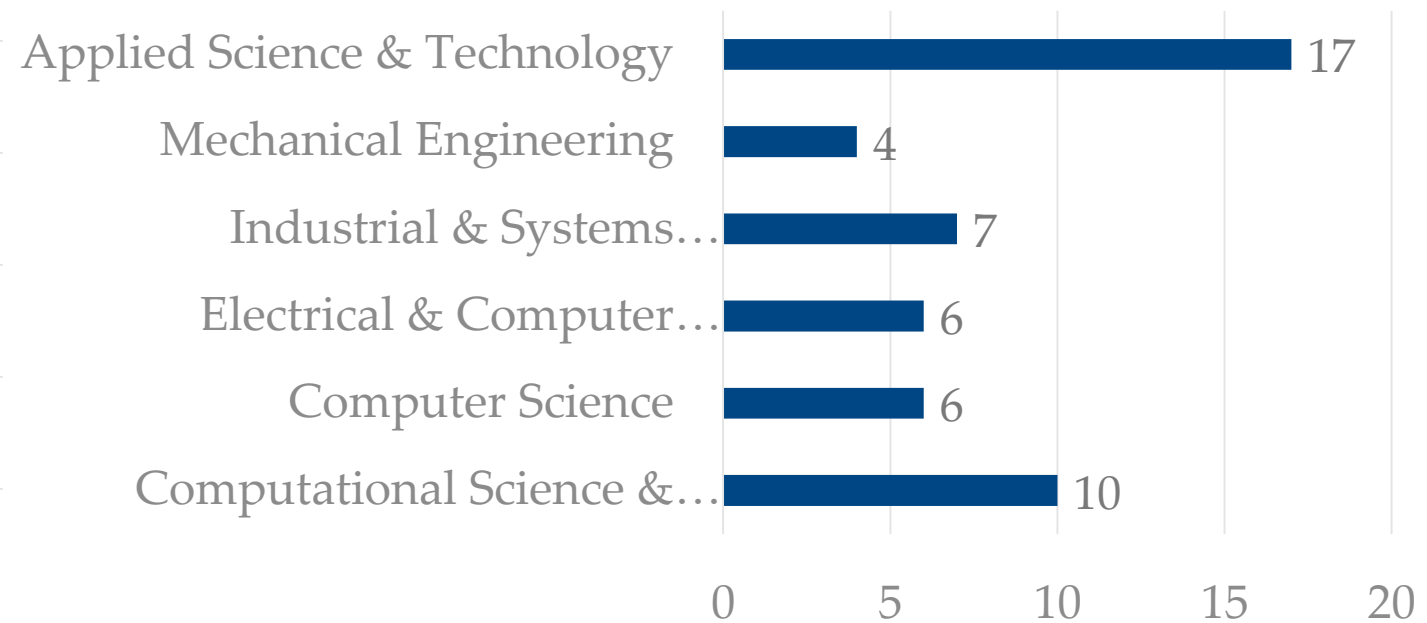




Chancellor's Fellows By College
