

# UNIVERSITY POLICY 306, REVOCATION OF DEGREE

## **PURPOSE**

- To clearly outline the due process requirements for students and the university's responsibilities when a question arises about whether a degree previously granted to a student should be revoked.
- Interim Policy Effective October 26, 2020 (pursuant to Section 1106.9 of University Policy 1106, Policy on Policies).
- Approval required by the Board of Trustees by virtue of the authority delegated by UNC Code/Policy Manual 100.1, Chapter 400 and Appendix 1.

## REASONS FOR REVOCATION



The degree was issued with an error (e.g., listing the wrong major or wrong degree) and the degree must be revoked to issue a new and corrected degree.



After examining the student's record, it is determined that the degree was issued, but the student had not fulfilled the requirements for award of the degree.



Information is discovered which, if known at the time, would have resulted in the degree not being conferred.

## REASONS FOR REVOCATION



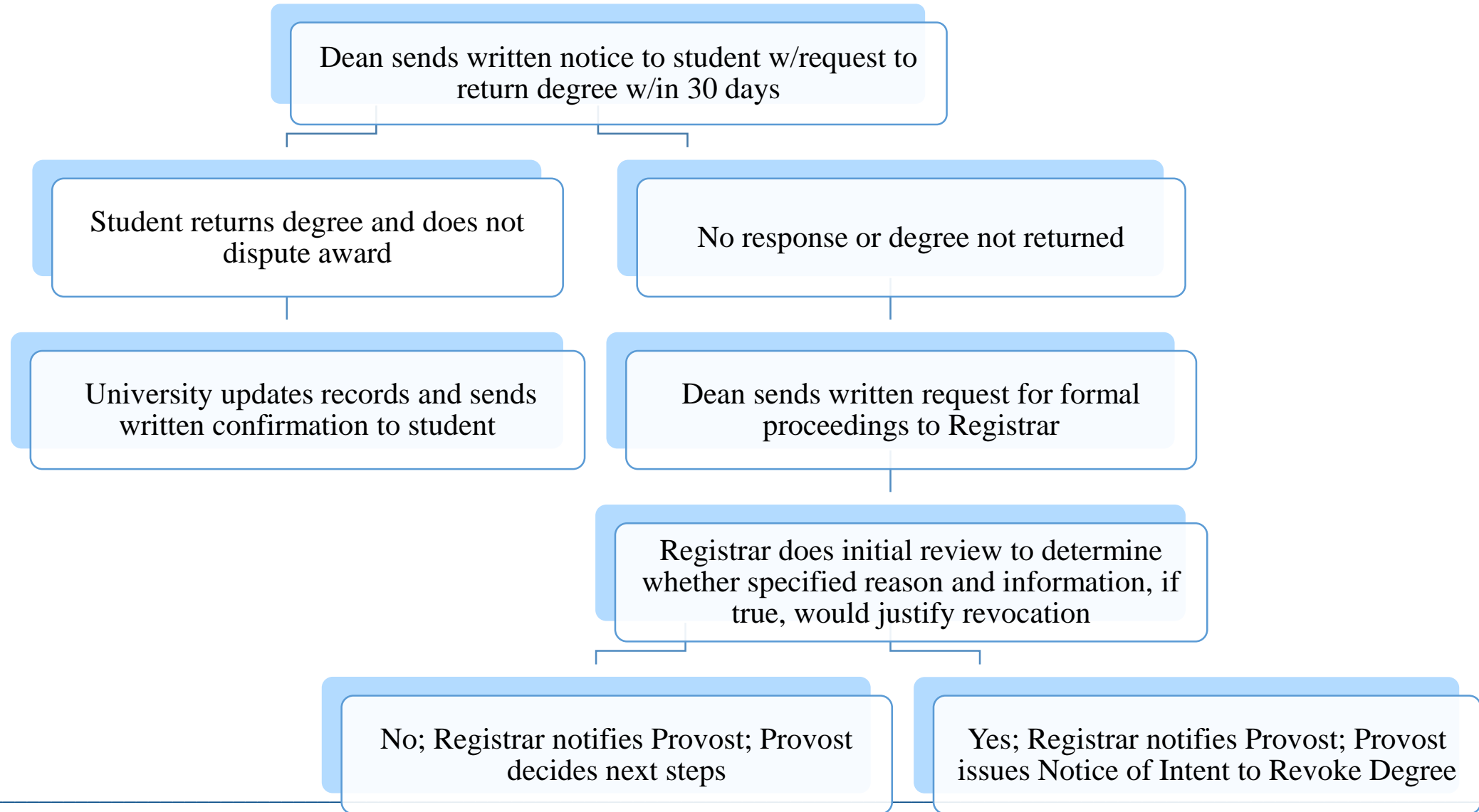
Errors by administrators, faculty, staff, or students which resulted in the granting the degree when the degree otherwise would not have been awarded; and

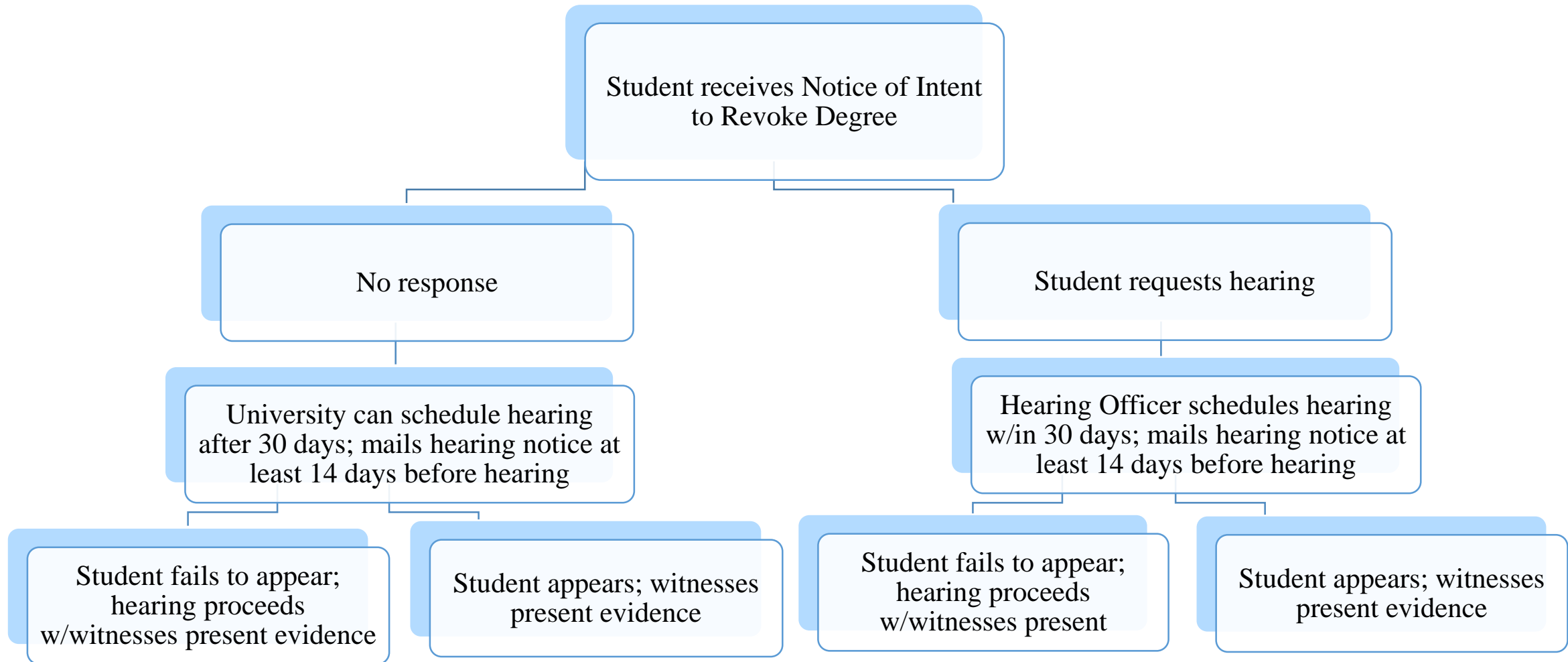


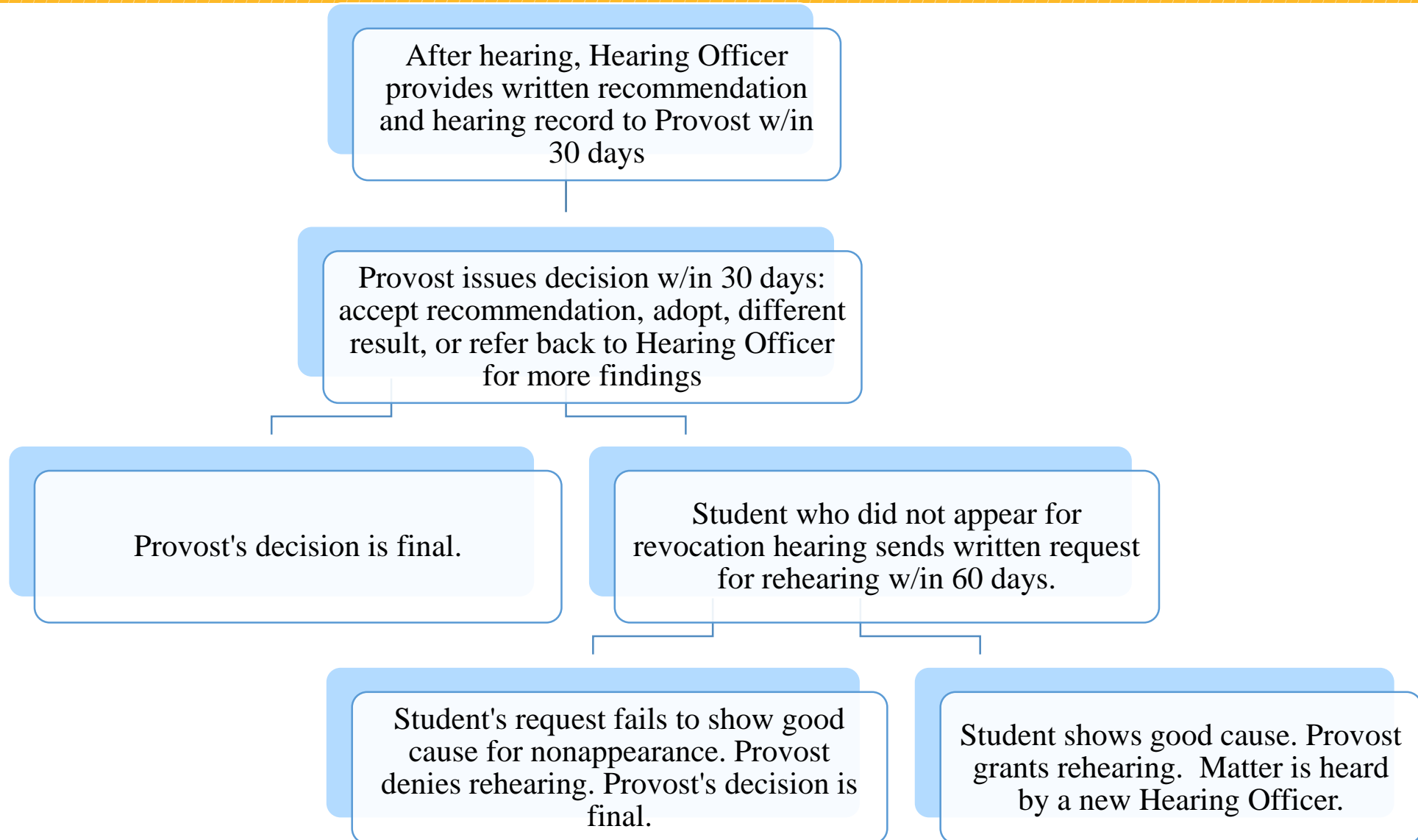
There was intentional misconduct by administrators, faculty, staff, or students, including fraud, dishonesty, falsification or unauthorized altering of information in or regarding a student record.



Other violations of law, policies, or the Student Code of Conduct that may have resulted in disciplinary action if the conduct was discovered before the degree was conferred.









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
